2. Describe how ***this annual progress report*** (not the credited Plan) was prepared and how it was submitted to the governing body, released to the media, and made available to the public:

The San Juan County, in conjunction with City of Farmington, City of Aztec, City of Bloomfield and the Town of Kirtland, adopted the San Juan County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Update. This annual progress report was completed for the City of Farmington's Floodplain Management involvement of activities within the plan. A copy of this annual report has been made available to City of Farmington Officials, as well as the public, through the City of the Farmington's Website. A notice of this report has been submitted to the Farmington Daily Times.

3. Provide a description of the implementation of each recommendation or action item in the action plan or area analysis report, including a statement on how the project was implemented or not implemented during the previous year:

- Farmington 2: Navajo Street Crossing at Glade Arroyo: Eliminate or reduce the potential for flooding at this crossing. Souder, Miller & Associates has provided a design to the City of Farmington.
  - The City is currently seeking funding to move forward with this project.
  - The project was not implemented during the previous year.

- Farmington 3: Hood Arroyo Detention Pond: reduce the risk of flooding in arroyos with documented historical damage with the construction of a detention pond.
  - Bohannon Huston Inc. has provided a conceptual layout to the City of Farmington. The City is currently working on acquiring a design for this project.
  - The project was not implemented during the previous year.
  
- Farmington 4: Develop a plan for additional protection of both the streambed and the installed box culvert structures at the Pinon Hills Crossing of the La Plata River.
  - The downstream concrete apron was extended and a cable concrete articulated block mat was installed however, additional protection may be required.
  - The project was not implemented during the previous year.
  
- Farmington 5: Develop a plan and install storm sewer that can adequately handle the currently developed surround areas near the old Downtown Farmington area. Upgrade the current storm sewer system in the older Downtown Main Street and Broadway Ave.
  - The Downtown Main Street from Miller Street to Auburn Ave has been reconstructed with improvements made the City's storm sewer.
  - The storm sewer system in Broadway Ave is still in need of an upgrade.
  
- Farmington 6: Incorporate all future comprehensive planning for Farmington with the San Juan County Mitigation Project: Ensure that Farmington's growth does not expand into area that expose the community to increased flood risks. Farmington has an ongoing planning effort to ensure that its growth is done in an organized manner. It is vital that all planning efforts consider the identified hazard locations in an around Farmington to avoid increasing the community's exposure to hazard risk.
  - This is an ongoing action plan and the City of Farmington is continually review and revising developments codes in both drainage and floodplain management.
  
- Farmington 7: Keep all waterways clear of debris and unwanted vegetation: Clean public waterways. Waterways lying in the publicly held areas of Farmington will be inspected annually for the presence of debris or unwanted vegetation.
  - The Community Works department has a cleaning schedule for all publicly held arroyos within city limits. The arroyos are on a 3-year rotation schedule. Additional cleaning and maintenance is completed outside of the 3 year schedule on a case by case, as needed, bases.
  
- Farmington 8: Promoting rainwater harvest systems: The City council will adopt a resolution recognizing the benefits of the rainwater harvesting systems. The

Community Works department provides information on the rainwater harvesting systems to the community at the Annual Home Expo.


- The City has not adopted a rainwater harvest system program, however, first flush stormwater retention requirements have been added to the City's development codes which allow for a percentage of the stormwater to be held on-site and to percolate back into the local groundwater system.
- Farmington 16: Public Education: A program will be created for school age children and adults designed to provide information concerning wise water usage and recommendations concerning drought resistant vegetation for use in both residential and commercial landscapes.
  - The Community Works Department provides education to the community at the Annual Home Expo.

4. Discuss why any objectives were not reached or why implementation is behind schedule:

The City continues to work on reaching solutions, and implementing solutions, to flooding issues when funding and/or grants become available.

5. What are the recommendations for new projects or revised recommendations?

The plan was recently updated and adopted in February 2021 and the projects on the list, which pertain to flooding, are listed in question 3. No new recommendations have been made during this reporting period and the City continues to work toward completing the items listed in Question 3.




