

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-1352

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND APPROVING A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF FARMINGTON AND THE NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (HSIP) FOR THE TRAFFIC SIGNAL RECONSTRUCTION AT WEST APACHE STREET AND WEST MAIN STREET (U.S. HIGHWAY 64)

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) solicited proposed projects for funding under the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) for Fiscal Year 2009/2010; and

WHEREAS, the City Of Farmington applied for and received approval for three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to reconstruct the traffic signal; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the reconstruction has been established as 90% Federal HSIP (\$270,000), 10% NMDOT (\$30,000); and

WHEREAS, the traffic signal at this location is over 40 years old and does not meet current design and safety standards; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmington agrees to design, install, assume ownership, liability, operations and maintenance responsibility for the traffic signal and it's amenities for the life of the signal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON:

SECTION 1:

That the City Council of the City of Farmington does hereby approve the Cooperative Project Agreement for the reconstruction of the traffic signal at West Main (U.S. Highway 64) and West Apache Street, Project Control Number 100090.

SECTION 2:

That the City Council does further authorize the Mayor of the City of Farmington to enter into the contract with the New Mexico Department of Transportation for any and all of the project described in this resolution and does authorize the Mayor to sign any other documents required by New Mexico Department of Transportation regarding this agreement for the reconstruction of the traffic signal at West Apache Street and West Main Street.
